

7:15 pm Leadership Updates — Cherise Ayers, Principal of Central High School

- We're in this T.O.G.E.T.H.E.R. Trust, Outreach, Growth Empathy, Transparency, Holding space, Equity, Respect. Cultivating a Central where everyone thrives.
- Safety and Security
 - This is a big topic right now and it's been a big topic. During the African American Parent Involvement Day, Principal Ayers stressed this is work we need to do together. These are not "school problems" - these are community problems that are brought into school because school is a part of the community.
 - Students have a divine right to be educated and have a divine responsibility for participating in their own learning.

- Prevention is us working together. We need to be in conversation with our students about what it means to be safe, being aware of our surroundings.
- Our building is understaffed. All the school buildings are right now but that won't stop us from doing better. Moving forward we will not let our lack of staff prevent us from having presence in the hallways. We will not wait for the district to provide the assistance, we will do it within the building so things are running the way they need to.
- Can parents volunteer to be in the hallways and stairways? Yes there would be training and background checks with the acknowledgement that not everyone can work with teenagers. Training would be needed. We need to have conversations with students to engage them, and remind them that they are capable and make sure they are *in class*.
