## **Envision SPPS: Statement of Purpose**

#### **ORIGINAL:** Develop and implement a plan and timeline to strategically:

- Align district resources, programs and schools.
- Ensure that all students and families have viable school options and access to high quality programming.

# **REVISED:** Ensure all families have equitable access to viable school programs.

(**Viable**: Defined as school programs that are academically well rounded, equitable, cost effective, in demand by families, and provide skills aligned to post-secondary education and employment opportunities.)




### **SPPS Achieves: Envision SPPS**

Strategic Focus Area: Objective 4: Program Evaluation / Resource Allocation Objective: Ensure all families have equitable access to viable school programs:

- Ensure buildings are maintained at capacity by merging or repurposing underutilized buildings and aligning school programs with their facilities.
- Align efforts with: "Strategic Focus Area: Effective and Culturally Relevant Instruction."
- Ensure solutions are equitable, viable, cost effective and align with our long-term outcomes.
- Identify how COVID-19 will have a long-lasting impact on traditional learning spaces and how this will inform how families will choose schools.




#### **High-level Project Organization Chart [original]**


