Our school is working to change practices and systems by identifying the barriers that make it harder for students of color to succeed and for their families to support their learning. Transitions between schools can be challenging, and we work to help families as their children start and leave our school.	 For new students and families, we support the transition by: Holding an intake with families so they can get to know their child's new team. 	
	 We provide multiple contacts (administration, social workers, case managers, behavior specialists, etc.) to families so they can always reach someone to have their questions answered. For students and families moving to a less restrictive setting, we support the transition by: Working with the receiving school to design an individualized transition plan which can include a split day between RiverEast and the new school, tours of the new school, and/or RiverEast staff attending the new school for a specific period of time.

Our school shares information about state standards, assessment, and student achievement with families in multiple ways	 Students receive P/NP grades and IEP progress reports, at least as frequently as in general education. Students in grades K-5 also receive SPPS grade level standards-based reports cards. This information is provided to parents to help monitor and support student progress towards grade level academic expectations. Parent-Teacher conferences are held in November and March at a time that is most convenient for the family. Conferences can be in person or virtual. Teachers and social workers reach out to families on a weekly basis to check in regarding students' progress. Families are invited to an intake before their child starts at RiverEast to have the opportunity to build relationships with
