SENIORS Complete Your FAFSA/ MN DREAM Act!

Want money for college? Then you MUST complete the FAFSA/MN Dream Act application. Seniors can begin to file their 2024-2025 FAFSA/MN Dream Act application starting **January 2024**. To file a FAFSA/MN Dream Act application, students and parents are required to report their 2022 income and tax information. When applying for federal or state financial aid with the FAFSA, you must be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or an eligible non-citizen. Undocumented students can apply for state financial aid by accessing the online MN Dream Act - State Financial Aid application.

ACT Test Prep with Xello

FREE ACT Prep programming is offered to all Saint Paul Public School 11th graders through the Methodize ACT Prep program on Xello.

Methodize is a self-paced online ACT prep program that offers full length practice tests, vocabulary builders and evaluation tests. These resources allow students to better understand what areas they may need more practice with when taking the ACT.

MN Bilingual Seals and Certificate Testing

If you can read, write, speak and understand another language, you may be eligible to earn up to 20 free college credits at any MN State College or University! Be recognized for your language ability and start your college career off right. Take a Seals of Bilingualism Assessment!

This test is open to 10th, 11th & 12th graders. Testing will occur at Highland from February 13th - 16th 2024.

ACT Update: I strongly encourage all students research their prospective colleges' guidelines/ requirements regarding the ACT. At the start of COVID many colleges changed their ACT requirements due to testing limitations. Many colleges have announced they will continue being test-optional (will not require the ACT test) for the class of 2024 and some have eliminated the requirement indefinitely.

Scholarships!

John F. Kennedy Profile in Courage Essay Contest- Essay contest open to students in grades 9-12. Applicants must submit an essay that describes and analyzes an act of political courage by a US elected official who served during or after 1917. Awards range from \$100-\$10,000. (Deadline 1/12/24)

WCF Scholarship- The annual National Washington Crossing Foundation Scholarship awards students completing twelfth grade (or final high school year) in 2023 who are planning careers in government service. Scholarship applicants must be citizens of the United States. The Trustees and Members of the Foundation, mindful of the significance of the important event in our nation's history that occurred at Washington Crossing, Pennsylvania, and New Jersey, believe that if our country is to continue to progress, we must have thoroughly trained, dedicated young people to carry on our government's work in future years. (*Deadline 1/15/24*)

<u>Children and Families Impact Scholarship</u>- The purpose of this scholarship is to support BIPOC students who are pursuing careers offering preventive services to children and families in Minnesota. Preventive services include, but are not limited to, mental health, behavioral health, and youth work. (*Deadline 1/15/24*)

<u>MSAA Diversity Scholarship</u>- We believe that supporting efforts to increase diversity within the health and human service profession is one important step to the reduction of disparities within this system and our diversity scholarships are intended to work toward this effort. (*Deadline 1/15/24*)

<u>3M Skilled Trade Program Scholarship</u>- 3M, in partnership with Minnesota State, announces the availability of two scholarships for students interested in the skilled trades. Each scholarship will be for up to \$15,000 over two years at any of the Minnesota State colleges and universities, beginning in the 2024-2025 school year (*Deadline 1/15/24*)

Mondale- Quie Essay Contest- The contest is open to Minnesota high school students in grades 11 and 12 who attend a public or private school (including charter and alternative-learning programs) or who are home schooled in Minnesota. (*Deadline 1/16/24*)

<u>United States JCI Senate Foundation Scholarship</u> - Each year, the U.S. Junior Chamber International (JCI) Senate Foundation grants \$1,500 scholarships to graduating high school seniors who plan to continue their education at accredited post-secondary colleges, universities or vocational schools. (*Deadline 1/19/24*)

<u>C-Span Student Cam Documentary Competition-</u> StudentCam is C-SPAN's annual national video documentary competition that encourages students to think critically about issues that affect our communities

and our nation. This year we are celebrating our 20th anniversary of the competition and for 2024, we are asking students in grades 6-12 to create a short (5-6 minute) video documentary on a topic that relates to the competition theme, "Looking Forward while Considering the Past." (*Deadline 1/19/24*)

<u>Public Housing Authority Scholarship-</u> In order to encourage academic excellence and community responsibility among high school students, PHADA has implemented a scholarship program for graduating seniors who are preparing to enter college. PHADA will award one scholarship one for \$7,000 and two for \$5,000 to deserving youth currently residing in a PHADA member agency. (*Deadline 1/26/24*)

<u>Union Plus Scholarship</u>- The Union Plus Scholarship awards are presented annually to union members or members of their families who want to begin or continue their post-secondary education. (*Deadline 1/31/24*)

SSA Native American Scholarship- The Native American Scholarships Fund is an endowment established to foster a sense of shared purpose and positive interaction between archaeologists and Native Americans. Scholarships are open to all Native peoples from anywhere in the Americas, Alaska Natives, Native Hawaiians, and Indigenous Pacific Islanders. (*Deadline 1/31/24*)

<u>Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) Scholarships</u>- Each year the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of higher education in diverse areas of study including history, economics, law, political science, medicine, nursing, occupational and physical therapy, elementary and secondary education, chemistry, math, science and English. (*Deadline 1/31/24*)

DAR American Indian Scholarship- A one-time \$4,000 scholarship is awarded to Native American college and technical students of any age, any tribe and in any state who have financial need and a minimum GPA of 3.25 based on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent GPA on the scaled used by the applicable educational institution. Applicants must be Native Americans and must be able to prove membership in a tribe that is recognized at a state and/or federal level. These awards are available for vocational training or college/university undergraduate or graduate students. Preference is given to undergraduate applicants. (*Deadline 1/31/24*)

Wallin 4 Year Scholarship- Minimum eligibility requirements are: minimum 3.0 GPA, attend a private/public non-profit four year college in MN, IA, SD, ND or WI or any HBCU immediately after high school (no gap year) and demonstrate financial need. Wallin winners receive \$4,000 a year for four years, get access to a professional advisor, get college to career programming and donor partner connections. (*Deadline 2/1/24*)

EngineerGirl Writing Contest- Open to students in grades 9-12. Applicants are required to write an essay on the given topic. First place winner will receive \$500. (*Deadline 2/1/24*)

Expedition Foundation's 2024 Scholarship- The \$1000 student award is for graduating high school seniors. You must be a member of Expedition Credit Union (formerly United Educators Credit Union), or the child, grandchild, or dependent of a member to be eligible for the award. You must be planning to attend a university, college, or community college in the fall of 2024. It is not necessary to demonstrate a financial need for the award. (*Deadline* 2/2/24)

Emmy Student Scholarship- We offer \$1,500 scholarship grants to students planning to major in journalism, broadcasting or electronic media at an accredited post-secondary educational institution. Scholarships are open to high school seniors and college/university sophomores & juniors or graduate students living or attending school in the five-state area served by the Upper Midwest Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences. (*Deadline* 2/2/24)

<u>The AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship</u> The American Meteorological Society is pleased to announce the AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship program, open to all high school students and

designed to encourage study in the atmospheric and related sciences. Serving as a unique example of various sectors of our field joining together to support young, talented minds, the scholarships are being sponsored by partners in industry, as well as through named scholarships either established by an AMS member or in memory of someone. The sponsors of these scholarships have all recognized the importance in encouraging young people to enter into the atmospheric and related sciences and thus have made generous contributions in support of the AMS Freshman Undergraduate Scholarship Program. (*Deadline 2/3/24*)

<u>Legacy Awards</u>- Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Children and grandchildren will compete separately against other children and grandchildren in their state. (*Deadline 2/5/24*)

<u>Point Foundation Community College Scholarship</u>- The Point Community College Scholarship empowers LGBTQ community college students to fulfill their ambitions in college. Whether you are eager to earn an associate degree and join the workforce or you intend to transfer to a four-year college or university, Point can provide financial aid and mentoring to help you achieve your educational goals. (*Deadline 2/8/24*)

Hon. Jeff Morris Scholarship- Be an undergraduate or graduate student studying renewable energy (in any sense, including economics, law, public policy, energy storage, demand response, grid-interactive efficient buildings and load flexibility, advanced grid modernization, greening of the grid, etc.) at any college or university in Oregon or Washington; or, be studying outside of Oregon and Washington, but be from one of those states, and intend to return to the Pacific Northwest after studies are complete; or, be a Native American or Alaskan Native student. (*Deadline 2/15/24*)

<u>Groth Music Scholarship</u>- The purpose of this fund is to award annual post-secondary scholarships for qualified students desiring to matriculate and pursue careers in music performance, music education, or music therapy. (*Deadline 2/22/24*)

AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities- The AMS Scholarship for Underserved Communities will award funding to students who have been traditionally underrepresented in the sciences, especially Hispanic, Native American, and Black/African American students. Funding for the scholarships is provided through donations made to the AMS Annual Giving Program. The \$6,000 two-year scholarship is for \$3000 per year during freshman and sophomore years (*Deadline 2/23/24*)

<u>Indian Health Services Scholarships</u>- The Indian Health Service (IHS) offers three scholarships for American Indian and Alaska Native students in order to educate and train health professionals to staff Indian health programs. We strive to develop our next generation of leaders, as well as help make the pursuit of a meaningful career in Indian health attainable for American Indian and Alaska Native students. (*Deadline 2/28/24*)

<u>TheDream.us National Scholarship</u>- Applications are open to undocumented immigrant students with or without DACA or TPS who came to the U.S. before the age of 16 and before Nov. 1, 2018. The National Scholarship Award will cover your tuition and fees at one of our Partner Colleges up to a maximum of \$33,000 for a bachelor's degree. (*Deadline 2/29/24*)

<u>Distinguished Raven FAC Memorial Scholarships</u>- This scholarship program is meant to provide educational assistance to the descendants of those the Ravens supported in their fight for the defense of their country. This assistance is intended to encourage the individuals to further their education and to reward the qualities that the Ravens and Laotian/Hmong forces admire. The funds are provided directly to the recipient to assist with tuition, lab fees, books, and other direct educational expenses. (*Deadline 2/29/24*)

MARvelous Education Fund- If you are planning to pursue higher education and are looking for ways to cover the cost, the Jewish Community Center's (JCC) MARvelous Education Fund can help. The fund will

award a \$5,000 scholarship to one recipient and is open to all Minnesota JCC members and staff. Preference is given to JCC involvement, academic achievement and financial need. (*Deadline 2/29/24*)

Horatio Alger State Scholarship- As one of the nation's largest need-based college scholarship programs in the country, the Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs specifically assist high school students who have faced and overcome great obstacles in their young lives. While many programs are directed primarily to recognizing academic achievement or leadership potential, the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need. (*Deadline 3/15/24*)

<u>Heartland Business Systems Scholarship-</u> Up to four recipients will be eligible to receive the Heartland Scholarship. Recipients will each receive \$2,500 to put towards continuing education. Students must have a 3.5 minimum GPA and intend to continue education <u>at</u> an accredited two – or four- year university or technical school, with an intended major in an Information Technology field. (*Deadline 3/30/24*)

Nari Cares MN Scholarship- NARI Cares Minnesota is pleased to announce that \$1,000 scholarships will be offered to three 2024 graduates from area MN High Schools. The scholarships will be awarded in \$500 increments renewable for two semesters. Student must be pursuing a post-secondary education at either a two-year or four-year educational or vocational institution relating to the field of construction or related trades in the Summer or Fall of 2024. (*Deadline 3/30/24*)

Starbase Scholarship- STARBASE Minnesota, located on the 133rd Airlift Wing in St. Paul, MN, and the 148th Fighter Wing in Duluth, has helped inspire and educate more than 80,000 Twin Cities' youth in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) since 1993 in five-day programs. Former STARBASE Minnesota students who attended during the school year and who are enrolled in post-secondary education are encouraged to apply throughout the year. STARBASE Minnesota scholarships are one-time \$1,000 awards, and will be presented directly to the recipient. SPPS Elementary Schools that participated in STARBASE: American Indian Magnet, Battle Creek, Cherokee Heights, Como Park, Crossroads, Eastern Heights, Farnsworth, Four Seasons, Frost Lake, Hamline, Hazel Park, Highwood Hills, Jie Ming, Randolph (*Rolling Deadline*)
