To promote this initiative there will be numerous college themed activities happening this month. Here are some things to keep on your radar:

National College Fair Field Trip for 12<sup>th</sup> Graders- The HP School counseling staff will be taking 12<sup>th</sup> graders to the National College Fair at the Mpls Convention Center on Thursday, Oct. 5<sup>th</sup> from 9:40am – 12:30pm. **ACT Update**: I strongly encourage all students research their prospective colleges' guidelines/ requirements regarding the ACT. At the start of COVID many colleges changed their ACT requirements due to testing limitations. Many colleges have announced they will continue being test-optional (will not require the ACT test) for the class of 2024 and some have eliminated the requirement indefinitely.

## **Scholarships!**

Minnesota Association for Korean American (MAKA) Scholarship- The Minnesota Association for Korean Americans (MAKA) is awarding a limited number of scholarships to Minnesota high school seniors of Korean origin/heritage who plan to pursue a higher education. The MAKA Scholarship Committee will award a scholarship of \$1500 to scholarship winners who are seniors in high school, have a minimum of 25% Korean heritage, minimum 3.0 gpa and have demonstrated academic excellence and strong leadership qualities. (Deadline 10/1/23)

<u>Precision Metalforming Association Educational Foundation Scholarship</u>- The Precision Metalforming Association Educational Foundation, in cooperation with PMA districts, are offering scholarships of \$1,000 or more to individuals seeking a career in the metalforming industry. Each award is for one year and will be granted based on academic merit. Post-secondary students may reapply for consideration the following year. No

applicant may receive more than two scholarship awards. Graduate students, trades job training, certificate program and apprentice applicants are limited to one award. (*Deadline 10/2/23*)

<u>Golden Door Scholars-</u> Status doesn't determine opportunity. Tenacity and hard work do. With our scholarship, undocumented students invest in their education and define their future. (*Deadline 10/1/23*)

<u>Coca-Cola Scholars Program</u>- This is an achievement-based scholarship. Students are recognized for their capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. 150 Coca-Cola Scholars will be selected to receive this \$20,000 scholarship. (*Deadline 10/2/23*)

Optimist Club Scholarship- 15-\$3000 scholarships will be awarded to St. Paul seniors! Applicants should have broad records of success at school and in community in the face of adversity (e.g. economic, familial, medical/disability, etc.) and 3.0+ GPA is recommended. (*Deadline 10/6/23*)

<u>Heisman High School Scholarship</u>- Applying for the Heisman High School Scholarship is your chance to be rewarded and gain local, state, and even national recognition for all that you've put into your high school career. If you've maintained at least a B average, participate in at least one of the school sponsored sports, are a leader in your community and role model at your school, then you've got what it takes. (*Deadline 10/17/23*)

<u>Carol Jorgenson Scholarship for Environment</u>- SAIGE will award a \$1,000 scholarship to two full-time students pursuing undergraduate degrees in an environmental stewardship discipline, including environmental studies, natural resource management, the natural sciences, public administration, public policy, and related fields. Eligible applicants must be affiliated with a federally recognized tribe and be a full-time student pursuing an undergraduate degree in an environmental stewardship discipline. (*Deadline 10/27/23*)

<u>United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP)-</u> Two student leaders from each state will participate in a remote learning experience about the work of their national government. Student delegates will hear major policy addresses by senators, cabinet members, officials from the Departments of State and Defense and directors of other federal agencies, and they will hear from the president of the United States and a justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. In addition, each delegate will also be awarded a \$10,000 college scholarship for undergraduate studies, with encouragement to pursue coursework in history and political science. (*Deadline* 10/28/23)

Voice of Democracy Scholarship- Voice of Democracy audio-essay program provides high school students with the unique opportunity to express themselves in regards to a democratic and patriotic-themed recorded essay. Each year, nearly 25,000 9-12 grade students from across the country enter to win their share of more than \$1 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the program.

The national first place winner receives a \$35,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school. A complete list of other national scholarships range from \$1,000-\$21,000, and the first place winner from each VFW Department (state) wins a minimum scholarship of \$1,000. (Deadline 10/31/23)

Ron Brown Scholarship- The Ron Brown Scholarship advances higher education for community-minded and intellectually gifted African Americans. RBSP competitively awards Ron Brown Scholars four-year \$40,000 scholarships (\$10,000 each year) to the most talented and economically-challenged high school seniors who demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship and global citizenship. (*Deadline 11/1/23*)

Aspiration in Computing Award- The National Center for Women and Information Technology (NCWIT) Award for Aspirations in Computing honors young women at the high-school level for their computing-related achievements and interests. Award recipients will be selected for their computing and IT aptitude, leadership

ability, academic history, and plans for post-secondary education. Minnesota Aspirations Award applicants will automatically be entered into the national NCWIT Aspirations Award competition. (*Deadline 11/6/23*)

Elks Most Valuable Student Scholarship- The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks will be awarding over 500 High School Seniors from across the country scholarships in the amount of \$2.44 million dollars. At our local Minnesota Lodge, they have given out more than \$80,000 in scholarships to seniors. (*Deadline 11/13/23*)

<u>Hispanic Heritage Youth Awards</u>. The Youth Awards honors Latino high school seniors who excel in the classroom and community and for their excellence in various categories including: Business & Finances, Entrepreneurship, Education, Healthcare & Science, Media & Entertainment, Sports and Technology. (*Deadline* 11/13/23)

<u>Jack Kent Cooke Scholarship</u>- The Cooke College Scholarship Program is an undergraduate scholarship program available to high-achieving high school seniors with financial need who seek to attend and graduate from the nation's best four-year colleges and universities. (*Deadline 11/16/23*)

<u>The Schoolhouse Connection Youth Leadership and Scholarship</u>. Our program is one of the nation's only national scholarship programs specifically serving youth that have experienced homelessness. The goal of our program is to provide financial assistance and staff and peer support to ensure that you are successful in getting to and through higher education and into the workforce. (*Deadline 11/24/23*)

Act Six Scholarship- Act Six is Minneapolis-St. Paul's only full-tuition, full-need urban leadership award. For Fall 2023, Act Six will select between 38 of the Twin Cities' diverse urban leaders for full scholarships to six partner colleges: Augsburg College, Bethany Lutheran College, Bethel University, North Central University, Concordia College- Moorhead and University of Northwestern. (*Deadline 11/28/23*)

MN Credit Union Foundation Scholarship Council- The council will be awarding \$18,000 in \$1,000 individual scholarships - providing 18 Minnesota credit union members the opportunity to cut the cost of college. Any member of a Minnesota Credit Union Network affiliated credit union pursuing post-secondary education in the fall 2024/spring 2025 *OR* is a high school senior graduating in 2024 is eligible to apply. (*Deadline 11/30/23*)

<u>The NHS Scholarship-</u> Since 1946, the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP) has awarded more than \$23 million in scholarships to outstanding NHS seniors. This year, we are awarding \$2 million in scholarships to 600 students. Each year, scholarship recipients are selected based on their demonstration of the four pillars of NHS: Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character. (*Deadline 11/30/23*)

Barbra Lotze Scholarship for Future Physics Teachers- The AAPT Board of Directors offers scholarships for future high school physics teachers. These scholarships, supported by an endowment funded by Barbara Lotze, are available only to U.S. citizens attending U.S. schools. Successful applicants receive a stipend of up to \$3,000 and a complimentary AAPT Student Membership for one year. The scholarship may be granted to an individual for each of four years. Applicants must declare their intent to prepare for a career in physics teaching at the high school level and must be a U.S. Citizen. (*Deadline 12/1/23*)

Ron Brown Scholar Program- The Ron Brown Scholarship honors the legacy of Ronald H. Brown through a selective scholarship program that advances higher education for community-minded and intellectually gifted African Americans. (*Deadline 12/1/23*)

<u>The Leadership Scholarship</u>- Our awards aim to financially support students in the Minneapolis/St. Paul Metropolitan Area who have supported their communities by contributing their time and energy to make their communities better places to live. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, you must be enrolled full time in

your last two years of high school, or your first year in college. You must either be currently living in affordable housing in Minnesota, or have lived in affordable housing in Minnesota in the past. (*Deadline 12/31/23*)
