6. TREASURER'S REPORT

- -The organization is financially healthy, with a surplus to help with upcoming shortfalls.
- -A couple of major changes: Grade Enrichment has been reduced by \$1K to \$1500 per Grade
- -The Teacher Grant is at \$150/teacher, Specialist is at \$500

Q: Why is there a 40% drop in Enrichment funding?

A: The allocation was studied, there is still some leeway as many times the funds are not maxed out, leaving more for those who go over

A: PTO makes up about 60% of the deficit in district funding in this area, teachers are limited to 3 field trips during the school year.

A: Liability and logistical problems with City bus use, most likely won't be approved.
