# 3. Groveland Multi-Age Classrooms - Follow-up (6:15-6:30)

Teachers from the 1st/2nd mutiage attended in Feb. to gather parent feedback. Parents were overwhelmingly positive about multiage this year. This is a chance to hear updates on plans for next year.

Ater the teacher feedback, we wanted to revisit this: Met with the (1st/2nd, 3rd/4th) teachers who would be affected, and here are some points that were shared, ideas floating around: -Add <sup>3</sup>⁄<sub>4</sub>

Heather: Parents loved all the advantages, shared those thoughts, teachers shared views, concerns: Tough to manage some of the "big jumps" academically, all the prep that can be necessary to pull it off successfully. Some factors yet with the specialists (Ms. Van?)

Tracy: They enjoyed the leadership skills that come with this, also, combining the groups allow for dividing the behavior issues between more groups (4) for a dispersion effect, and also distribute potential leadership more broadly. Things flow, curriculum-wise

Doug: Are there other Elementary schools in SPPS that we could compare to:

Tracy: Only Montessori, but there is a consulting teacher from a Woodbury school that is ALL multi-age with several years under their belt, and they are willing to be a consulting resource.

Becky: Expo used to, but discontinues it

Tracy: Yes, they tried 3 grade levels together.

Angie: How do you develop a (e.g.) reading curriculum? Do you have to teach it twice? Do they get grouped by ability?

Tracy: Last year, after parent consultation, and some buy-in, we were able to accommodate requests. This year, we did the planning and asked the parents to trust us to make the best judgement for the children. There's layering that goes on individually after a whole-group lesson typically.

Jen: Math is the only subject that you break out seperately?

Tracy: Yes, we don't want there to be "holes" in their knowledge, as with Reading, kids are always welcome to try things above their level, even if their lesson is still at grade level.

Becky: There's some concern about social/emotional differences in the 3rd-4th combo, and the other factors (budgets, enrollment, due at the end of the month) will give us a better picture, so it's still a bit early now to look at exact plans.

Tracy: To have it work in 3/4, the Maths would have to be split out, it's just too difficult.

Becky: It all takes so much planning time, this year's ½ teachers really wanted to do it, and have had a good time with it.

Jen: What about the 3 4th grade classes?

Becky: Most likely we'd stay at 2 5th grade, but there are so many variables and it's still too early to tell.

Rob: It has been talked about here that it's a potential marketing point that can assist in helping enrollment growth.

Sarah: Can we maybe expect some more ideas and numbers by next

Doug: Maybe a long-range planning aspect, putting an 18-month plan, a roadmap to get to some type of endgame in place?

Tracy: Would it help that Placement is aware

NOTE: During meeting with Jackie Turner and Janae Williams from Placement Office, they specifically mentioned that multi-age classrooms were a potential way to help mitigate losses to student population, adding some flexibility. Is this actual potential, or are they just saying that? How to inquire/push?

David: Room for a new committee, focus group.
