Dear Harding High School Families:

Quarter 3 conferences (virtual) will happen on **Thursday, February 25, 2021 from 4 to 7 PM**. All Harding teachers are setting up a conference schedule on an APP called Calendly. Complete details about how to access teachers' calendars and sign up for a conference slot is below.

Students should attend the virtual conference with parents and should assist parents to sign up using their iPads and Schoology accounts. Teachers will post their conference calendars in the 'Updates' section of each of their classes on Schoology.

When you sign up, please include your name and your student's name so teachers can prepare for you. A small number of Harding teachers may have conflicts on one of those evenings will be providing alternate conference dates and times. Please check the specific date for the specific teacher you want to see. Most will be on the 25th.

All teacher calendars will be accessible by 8:00 a.m. on Monday, February 22, 2021. Some are already posted. Here are detailed instructions. They are also available on the Harding's website.

Welcome to the HHS Virtual Parent/Teacher Conferences!

Who: Students are expected to work together with their parents to sign up for conferences.

What: Parents and students select a 10 minute conference time in calendar link-Calendly.

Where: Calendly link will be on each teacher Schoology page (updates section).

When: February 25, 2021 from 4 to 7pm

How: First time users: Watch the brief tutorial video below to sign up in Calendly. Decide what teachers you want to see for conferences. Students and parents together go to the individual teacher Schoology page to sign up. Sign in with student name and email, or with parent name and email AND include student name in message box. Since conferences are a scheduled time, teachers will help to monitor the time so they can get to the next conference appointment.

Do you need an interpreter to attend the conference? Interpreters are available in Hmong, Spanish, Karen, and Somali. Let the teacher know if another language is needed. Write this request in the Calendly invite. Students may also directly ask their teachers to request an interpreter.


Student Drop-off and Pick-up: Please be timely if you are driving your student to Harding, especially during these colder months. IPASS times are from 12:30-3:00. Students will wait outside and will not be allowed to gather in the atrium or doorways. Right now, avoiding large indoor gatherings is an important mitigation strategy for schools.

Spring 2021 IB-DP Exams Update

Dear IB DP students and families,

This winter, the IBO requested and reviewed data from schools and had extensive conversations with school administrators globally to ensure consistency and fairness to all IB students and schools.

Based on information the three IB DP High Schools in SPPS provided to the IBO, and in line with local and national health and safety restrictions, the IBO determined that SPPS is unable to administer examinations.

Therefore, IB Diploma Program students' results at Central, Harding, and Highland Park High Schools will be awarded using coursework marks, internal assessments, and predicted grades for the May 2021 examination session.

Things to keep in mind with this decision:

- All students will still earn an IB score for their learning this year. These scores will still offer the potential for earning college credit.
- All students currently pursuing the IB Diploma will still be eligible to achieve this important milestone.
- The focus for spring 2021 can continue to be on students during this complex time
 - With all that remains uncertain, including the increased anxiety students, families, and teachers are experiencing, this pathway allows teachers to maintain their focus on providing a quality IB learning experience, and supporting students' continued social- and emotional-learning needs.



ACCESS for ELLs Testing

Taking Place March 1 - April 1

ACCESS for ELLs is a standardized test that measures students' academic English growth and proficiency in listening, reading, speaking and writing. If your child is currently identified as an EL student, he/she is required to take this test. This test provides important information for your child and Harding High School. The results of this assessment help Harding staff make sure that your student is receiving the language support he/she needs and placed in classes that are appropriate for him/her. This test also determines if your student is ready to exit the EL program.

Please note: the ACCESS test must be completed in person. This means your child will need to report to Harding on the dates we share with you to take the test. The test will take two afternoons to complete.

You have the right to refuse ACCESS testing for your student. *If you <u>do not want your child to take the ACCESS test</u> <u>this year</u>, please contact one of the EL teachers below by email, text or phone call. Please include your child's <i>name, grade, and their student ID number in the message*. If you have already filled out and returned the letter that was sent to your home from the district, your response has already been recorded and you do not need to submit it again.
