Coming Up and Going On

Admin Corner

Dear Harding Family,

Thank you for your support as we continue the school year in distance learning. I am writing to you today with more details about the in-person support that will be offered at Harding High School.

As we prepare to add this support, there will be no instruction January 29-February 3. Distance learning will resume on Thursday, February 4. It is important to keep in mind that distance learning will remain the primary learning model for all students at this time. This new program is a way to offer some in-person connection with teachers and peers for those students who want/need it. There will be no new instruction during this in-person time.

Students will come to school if identified for in-person support, starting the Monday after the COVID-19 case rate for Ramsey County remains under 30 cases per 10,000 people for two consecutive weeks. At this time, the earliest possible start date is Tuesday, February 16, 2021.

9-12 Schools

- Students who are identified as needing additional support will come to school for 2.5-hour appointments.
- In-person support will be offered Monday-Thursday from 12:30- 3 p.m. The number of days a student will come is based on need and other data points.
- To start, students who need support to graduate or pass their classes, multilingual learners, special education students, and those who need additional social-emotional support will be prioritized.
- We are working on ways to provide additional support for as many students as possible as the school year progresses.
- The approximate number of students on-site at a time will be 11-14 per classroom, or about a third of total enrollment.
- Fridays will be distance learning days.
- If you do not want your child to be considered for on-site support, please let us know please let us know by <u>filling out</u> this form by January 29.
- If you have not already filled out the form, please have your student complete the interest survey emailed to their student gmail account last Thursday, 1/20/21.
- Students will be identified by a set of criteria and receive support in core subject areas as well as selected electives.
- Students will be grouped together in the room with 7 or 8 peers and spend the 2.5 hours in the same classroom with the same teachers all through the support cycle.
- Planning for the start of the in person student support at Harding for semester 2 all classes will start at 8:30 am instead of 9:00 am. In addition, our asynchronous day has been changed from Wednesdays to Fridays for 2nd semester.

Based on the challenges students continue to face in distance learning, SPPS is offering an opportunity for all 9-12th grade students who earned a NP grade in one or more classes during the first quarter to earn a D in the first quarter by successfully earning a passing grade in the 2nd quarter. **2nd quarter ends on Thursday, January 28th, 2021**.

In the 2nd quarter, any passing grade, A+ thru D-, will result in students receiving a grade of D- for the 1st quarter.

Please have your student continue to work with their teachers and counselor to recover first quarter credits toward graduation. These grading changes for the first quarter strive toward equitable grading practices. We understand that distance learning, along with the stress of living through a pandemic, has an impact on our students.
