

## LEAP High School Goals

**Reading:** The passing rate of Language Arts courses in grades 9th and 12th will increase from 93% to 95% by June 2024. The growth in lexile of students using Achieve3000 will increase from 52 points in the 2021-2022 school year to 57 lexile points in 2023-2024.

**Math:** The passing rate of Mathematics G1 and G2 courses in grades 9th through 12th will increase from 76% to 81% as monitored quarterly and measured by Final Marks report in BOLT by June 2024.

### Culture and Climate:

LEAP staff will focus on social-emotional learning during the year with ongoing building and district level professional development and coaching.

### College and Career Pathways

We incorporate career readiness at all levels by exposing students to multiple college and career options. Advanced English students take the Accuplacer Diagnostic. Our goal is for 100% of our senior cohort to submit a college and/or job application.

- \* Decrease disparities in achievement based on race, ethnicity, culture and identity.
- \* Increase achievement of English Learners and students receiving special education services.
- \* Increase academic growth in reading and math for all students
- \* Prepare all graduates for college, career and life.
