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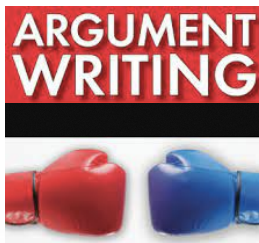
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ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS 7

Students will end the quarter with checklisting and revising their rough draft essay work into final draft format.

How to Write an Argument

- ✓ Collect evidence that allows you to think through various sides of an argument
- ✓ Rehearse by explaining your positions and listing your reasons point by point
- ✓ Plan your claim and reasons into boxes-and-bullets structure

READING AT HOME

Reading at home for **30 minutes each day** is a continued expectation for 7th grade students. There is no shortage of reading material available to students. In addition to physical books, students have access to multiple apps on their iPads with digital books. All reading logs and login information are linked in ELA7 classes in Schoology for students. Please be encouraging students to work toward this 30 minute reading goal each day as it will help to improve comprehension skills and boost testing scores.

GRADING & HOMEWORK

All classwork, practice, and assessments (projects, tests, quizzes, performances) will be graded according to proficiency on the Common Core Standards. Students will receive a score of 0 - 4.

- 0 - incomplete
- 1 - beginning
- 2 - developing
- 3 - proficient
- 4 - exceeds

**** A score of 0 - 2 can be redone until the student reaches a score of at least 3 (within the designated quarter).**

Grades are weighted:
20% - classwork
80% - assessments
