Impressionism: An Art Style

Impressionism is a 19th-century art movement that originated with a group of Paris-based whose independent artists exhibitions brought them to prominence during the 1870s and 1880s. Impressionist paintcharacteristics include ing relatively small, thin, yet visible brush strokes, open composition, emphasis on accurate depiction of light in its changing qualities (often accentuating the effects of the passage of time), ordinary subject matter, inclusion of movement as a crucial element of human perception and experience, and unusual visual angles.

The Impressionists faced harsh opposition from the conventional art community in France. The name of the style derives from the title of a Claude Monet work, Impression, soleil levant (Impression, Sunrise), which provoked the critic Louis Leroy to coin the term in a satirical review published in the Parisian newspaper Le Charivari.

The development of Impressionism in the visual arts was soon followed by analogous styles in other media that became known as impressionist music and impressionist literature.



School attendance matters

School attendance is mandatory in the state of Minnesota in order make certain that all children acquire the necessary skills for success as adults. Creative Arts Secondary School cooperates through the Ramsey County Attorney's office and the Student Attendance Matters program.

The program requires on-going intervention with students who have multiple absences from classes or school. The motto is: Be in school everyday, every class, on time, unless lawfully excused.

Acceptable reasons for absences include:

- Sickness (fever of 100 degrees or higher)
- Vomiting
- Severe diarrhea
- Medical/dental appointments (medical/ dental provider excuses required). Please note students cannot be absent for a full day for routine appointments.

- Religious holidays
- Extreme family emergencies (death, fire etc)


Invalid excuses include:

- Staying home to baby sit
- Staying home to care for parents, grandparents or other family members
- Needed at home
- Missing the school bus
- Lack of immunization
- Car trouble
- Work/rest because of work
- Travel
- Cold weather

Please call the school when your child is going to be absent (call 651-292-3480 and select the attendance option). Please provide a written note when child returns. If absent 3 or more days for illness a medical excuse note may be needed.
