What is Power of YOU? Minnesota's Power of YOU means two years of tuition-free college for eligible students allowing Power of YOU participants to transfer to a four-year college or university or enter the workforce with little or no student debt., Power of YOU will pay for all tuition costs that are not covered by state and federal grants. Along with financial assistance, Power of YOU helps students reach their academic and career goals with advising and academic support services.

To qualify for Power of YOU, students must: • Graduate June 6th, 2017 with your Creative Arts class,

• Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), and • Not exceed the family adjusted gross income of \$75,000


Actors shared insight into lines out loud — and not just reading them in your head as one of the secrets to getting things right.


