

do you know? Sound!

Sound, which is the movement of air, travels in **waves**. All sounds can be reduced to, or created from, a singular wave.

When listening to sounds, parts of the human ear are vibrating. When speaking, a voice causes the air around it to travel, which causes pieces of the ear to vibrate accordingly.

Microphones operate in a similar way. After sound is emitted through the diaphragm, it begins to vibrate and is converted into a signal. On the other hand, when someone receives a signal, it causes pieces of the speaker to fluctuate back and forth, which then causes the air around it to travel.

In many ways, sound is very much like light. They both emerge from a sure source. However, while light can travel through a **vacuum**, sound cannot do the same. It requires a medium to maneuver through, such as glass, metal, water or air.

The speed of sound is dependent on the medium through which it is traveling. Under typical conditions, at sea level, sound travels 1,225 kilometers per hour, or 340.29 meters per second! From the Principal **Planning begins for 16-17**

Habits of Mind (and what they mean)

Whether your art form is dance or painting, a spoken word artist or an actor, there are certain "habits of mind" that have been discussed as some of the soft skills that transcend each discipline **Express** and unite creative individuals across the disciplines.

The following eight studio habits of mind were developed by Project Zero, part of **Observe** the Harvard School of Education:

Develop Craft

Learning to use tools, materials, artistic conventions; and learning to care for tools, **Reflect**

materials, and space.

Engage & Persist

Learning to embrace problems of relevance within the art world and/or of personal importance, to develop focus conducive to working and persevering at tasks.

Envision

Learning to picture mentally what cannot be directly observed and imagine possible next steps in making a from mistakes. piece.

Learning to create works that convey an idea, a feeling, or a personal meaning.

Learning to attend to visual contexts more closely than ordinary "looking" requires, and thereby to see things that otherwise might not be seen.

Stretch & Explore

Learning to reach beyond one's capacities, to explore playfully without a preconceived plan, and to embrace

Community

Learning to interact as an artist with other artists i.e., in classrooms, in local arts organizations, and across the art field) and within the broader society.

Additional habits of mind that have been thought of includ Listening with Empathy, Metacognition, Finding Humor, Thinking Flexibly, Willingly Suspending Disbelief,

Learning to think and talk Thinking Interdependently, with others about an aspect even Responding with Wonderment and Awe.

Think about your own one's own work and working creative ideas or solutions to challenging problems or situations. When and where do you find yourself working through challenges in unique ways? How do you continue when the going gets tough? When have you found a new, creative solution to a problem that you never knew you knew?

All of these characteristics are pieces of the arts educational experience that Creative Arts Secondary School is building into our curriculum and our expectations for learning.

We believe that these Habits of Mind are key to our students' success. Together we can meet our mission to develop creative young adults in rigorous artistic and academic ways.
