CASS is also committed to developing academic artists. We are here to ensure that all students are developing academically. All student assignments are posted on Schoology. Parents have access to their student's Schoology accounts through Parent Portal. Parents can monitor student's progress in each class through this site. Works are currently on display in the Multipurpose Gallery at school through Friday, February 10.



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
