As of July 2017, Puerto Rico's population is 3,351,827.

Only 55% of the island has power as of January

Students take second quarter finals January 24 and 25

Wednesday, January 24

January 25th marks the end of second quarter. and all students will take a cumulative final in each of their courses. Finals will address the most important topics and standards taught 2nd quarter. Teachers have already started talking to students about finals so they know what to expect.

Some things we'd like to highlight for families:

We are operating on a different schedule for the two finals days. We want to ensure there is enough time for each class so that students don't feel rushed. We also did not want students to take seven finals in one day. The schedule below spreads finals out over two days.






Get ready to Read Brave!


Who: CASS Students • What: Any medium of artwork that follows the theme of "Winter"
