Make Your Summer Plans Now

Spring is fast approaching. Saint Paul Public Schools is now accepting registration for S-Term (summer school). There aretwo options: S-Term 1 is from June 19 through July 13 and S-Term 2 is from July 17 through August 10.

Middle School - Eighth grade students can only register for S-Term 2. Families who live within the historic Rondo neighborhood are also eligible for Freedom School, which operates from July 17 to August 25. An alternative to S-Termare the FREE multi-district programs such as National Youth Sports Program (NYSP) and Camp Teranga with ArtsUs. Families will receive S-Term and multi-district program registration form in the Additionalforms mail. are available in the counseling center.

High School- Students who need credit recovery should contact their counselor for register for S-Term. Please note that studentswho miss more than 2 days during S-Term will not receive credit for the course.

Reclaim partners with Creative Arts
