Creative Arts students are creative, and they are multi-talented. They also have lots of interests as creative individuals. This is why we want to provide as many opportunities as we can for students to "show up" in their art forms — both during the day *and* in their activities after school.

There has been a significant push to bolster our after-school offerings in terms of clubs and activities for students. Our goal was to have at least one extracurricular opportunity in each of our major art forms all year, and we have succeeded.

For our literary artists, we have WordFreaks, an after-school group hosted by Ms. Corrigan and Ms. Goebel that meets Mondays. WordFreaks has been around for a few years, as a printed publication supported by Mr. O'Reilly. This year, our two advisors are taking the publication online and developing a new way for our writers to showcase their work. The hope is to also include a place visual artists as well.

Performing artists have a number of options: Glee Club with Ms. Keller is also on Mondays is a non-audition group open to students in grades 8-12. Mr. Jon (our orchestra and band teacher) has a non-audition rock band for high school students that meets before school first hour on Wednesday and Thursday mornings. Ms. Noble's audition based Dance Team had auditions in October and is heading into their third week of practices this week. Theater students are busy rehearsing the fall one-act plays (*Alice in Wonderland* and *Super Hero Support Group*). Be sure to mark your calendars for the first week of December

performances.

Finally for our visual artists, Art Club is a newly formed opportunity that meets on Thursdays for both middle school students (2-3 p.m.) and high school students (3-4 p.m.). We are still looking for someone to assist with a Photography Club, based on student requests. Sewing Club is another activity that meets on Wednesdays.

Other academic, interest-based, and service-related clubs include: Anime Club, a student-run group that meets on Mondays after school; LEGO Robotics is open to 6th-8th grade students and is supported by our school's EDL program and led by Ms. Collis and Ms. Swenson on Mondays and Wednesdays; "GSA" stands for Gender Sexuality Alliance and meets on Wednesday from 2-4 p.m. with Ms. Weller; Chess Club on Thursdays is a fun group that Mr. Anderson started; Student Council meets with Mr. Ruble on Thursday afternoons as well and is foced on service learning in the school.

Students are encouraged to participate in after-school activies as much as possible — to meet new friends, expand their horizons, and participate in things they can't fit into their school-day schedule. Research has found that students who participate in after-school activities often feel more connected to their peers, their school, and the academic and social environment of school overall.

We are always looking for more ways for our students to get involved. Please see Mr. Lacina if you have any ideas, any questions, or would like to support one of these great activities as a parent, guardian or community member. 


New student work is on exhibit in the Creative Arts gallery: Opening night of The Rebirth of The Rebirth, Thursday, Nov. 14!

Financial Aid workshop for students & families

Seniors attending college after high school will need to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Creative Arts

Secondary School is hosting a FAFSA College Financial Aid Workshop in collaboration with Minnesota College Goal on November 15 from 6-8 PM. Students and parents/ guardians are strongly encouraged to attend this event together. Students and parents/guardians will need to bring their 2016 tax forms (including any information on 529 Plans, investments and savings accounts), social security number (SSN) or alien registration number (green card), driver's license (if you have one), a non-SPPS email account, and list of

colleges student are applying. Students attending this event will be entered in a drawing for a \$500 scholarship.
