Reading: The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 56% to 62% by Spring 2022 as measured by the MCA.

Math: The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 55% to 62% by Spring 2022 as measured by the MCA.

In Classrooms

Teachers will work with students and their families to support students' successes in academics. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Providing home practice for students in both math and reading at appropriate instructional levels.
- Sending home communications that include a schedule of school and classroom events, that may include tips or games for having fun learning at home, along with volunteer opportunities.
- Providing access for home learning links including the use of Seesaw, Schoology, Campus, Clever and/or other applications on the iPad.
- Communicating with caregivers about their child's progress.
- Provide social-emotional, anti-bullying, and self-care lessons.

At Home

Groveland caregivers joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' successes in academics. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- Develop good homework habits. Read daily, both independently and together, in your home language and/or in English.
- Reach out to and communicate with your child's teacher frequently. Let the teacher know anything that could help your child. Read the class communications, paying attention to the school website, and other applications your child's teacher is using.
- Practice basic math facts.
- •Be sure your child gets enough sleep and is ready to attend school regularly.

Students are getting involved too!

- Ask my teacher questions when I don't understand.
 - Talk with my family about school.
 - Do my best on homework.

Caregivers: Ask your child what ideas they have for making connections between home and school.
