Welcome: Welcoming folks in person and online. Introductions were made, agenda was reviewed.

Treasurer Report:

- The PTO's registration with the Minnesota Secretary of State has been updated through the end 2022. Soon we will re-register with the Office of the Attorney General.
- The current balance of the PTO checking account is \$56,620.11, with approximately \$1,000 expenses for the Fall Family Gathering coming soon!
- Give to the Max Day: Be on the lookout for our annual direct appeal fundraising letter from Dave, which will be mailed to OWL families this week. The letter kicks off our biggest fundraiser, Give to the Max Day a huge day of online giving to non-profits that this year takes place on Thursday, November 18th. This year we have an ambitious goal of raising \$20,000 for experiential learning, primarily Fall Retreats. We've met this goal in the past and have high hopes we can do it again! We hope you'll consider a donation to the PTO online on Give to the Max Day, or by using the envelope enclosed in the direct donation letter in any amount that works for your family. We want to stress that the school did not ask families for any fees to offset the fall retreat this year.
 - Most years we have a nice sized matching grant from \$1000 up to \$13,000! one year
 from multiple donors. To date, we do not have any match donors. Anyone who would like to make a matching grant donation should call or email Dave.

Principal Report:

- Fall Retreats: Last time we met we were a week away from Fall Retreats. Every grade had different things going on during the week especially outdoors, and especially on the West Side.
- Lots of staff have been out due to COVID-like symptoms while they wait for test results. This has made long term planning harder, and short term planning easier.
- Growing number of kids showing up in the office with cold-like symptoms that need to be properly addressed.
- Fall sports are wrapping up.
- EDL/Flipside started last week. About 40-50 kids are participating. In addition theater started yesterday and drop in practices for archery. Some classes are full, but many have space. No transportation this year. We are planning to have both a theater and choir performance.
- Latinx daily event was postponed until Spring to allow for more planning.
- Asian family night planned for December 1.
- After MEA students will be allowed to find new seats in their same zone at lunch. The cafeteria seating chart has been very useful for contact tracing.
- Digital Learning Day on November 2 (all kids are school from home).

• 15 students (11 & 12th graders) have signed up to participate in "Grit Lab" with about 85 students in schools from around the country. We attempted to watch a video called "Grit Lab 101 Lecture 6.1", related to goal setting. Technology hurdles were a barrier.

• Homecoming Week: Usually we have a fall dance - but no dance this year. So we had a homecoming hangout after the Ultimate game. It was a good alternative to a dance. Spirit Week usually revolves around the theme of the dance the week leading up to it, this year spirit week followed homecoming. "Anything but a backpack" day was a hit.
