Welcome: Welcoming folks in person and online. Introductions were made, agenda was reviewed.

Principal Report:

- Mask policy change: Change implemented yesterday going well at OWL. The majority of students are continuing to wear their masks. We have recess time now at lunch (last 15 minutes), and kids can now sit where they would like in the lunchroom (which oddly has made the lunchroom quieter).
- Enrollment and budget process: We receive our budget on April 26 (a month later than usual).
 Anticipating a significant deficit for the district. We are one of only a few schools showing stable/growing application numbers. Enrollment projection is currently 510 (largest enrollment we have had). We expect some attrition. Dave will do a budget presentation once ready, in person, students are welcome to attend.
- Field work: Have a couple of great 8th grade trips coming up. We will not be able to go out to
 Lake Elmo on the last day of school this year due to bus availability. Transportation will be our
 biggest hurdle for any retreats going forward. Are sending Seniors up to Camp du Nord, and
 busing costs for that trip have tripled since 2017.
- Interim: Registration starts tomorrow (4/20). Fifteen classes to pick from, they list a top three. Outward Bound heading to Deep Portage for service work, otherwise all trips are local.
- Donut Declaration Day: Next Friday. Where Senior students declare where they are going to college.

Treasurer Report:

- The current balance of the PTO checking account is \$85,462.10.
- We only had two transactions since the last PTO meeting, both ongoing deposits from last November's Give to the Max fundraising campaign.
- We anticipate upcoming expenses for interim and spring community grants.
- The PTO Leadership Team met to assemble a budget for next year, and it will be ready to present and vote on at the next regular PTO meeting in May.

Student Report:

- Final quarter has started!
- Excited about prom coming up on Saturday, 4/23. 5 7PM (middle school) 7 10PM (HS)
- Spring play is next week! 4/27, 4/28, 4/29 at 7:00 PM each night at OWL.
- It is a busy time, but also exciting.

- Asked more specifics about retreats.
 - Asked parents if they would chaperone, 53% said they would chaperone several nights overnight, 67% said they would chaperone an overnight, and 82% said they would chaperone a day trip.
- 75 student responses. [Questions are shortened below for brevity.]
 - What kind of experiences do you (or would you) prefer for fall retreats? (Could select more than one answer).
 - Experiences with the natural world: 88%
 - Service project experiences: 35%
 - College or career experiences: 24%
 - Would you prefer a fall retreat close to OWL in the local community or a retreat outside the metro area? (Could select more than one answer).

Local/near school: 12%Outside the area: 41%

I enjoy both: 64%

Do you participate in sports or other after school activities that would make it difficult for you to participate in an overnight retreat?

No: 61%Yes: 24%

- 15% with responses similar to: "Yes, but I am okay with missing it"
- Dave: We know that overnights are highly valued by parents and students, but are hard on staff, and we have licensing requirements (requiring a certain number of teachers). We anticipate receiving 60% of the cost from fees paid from students. \$25,000 comes from the PTO and the remainder from the Principal's budget. This gets us about \$10,000 per grade.

OWL Spring Grant Awards:

- Five applications were submitted. Were able to fully fund four and partially fund the last. Funds come from the PTO. Proposals were discussed in a committee format to decide.
 - Inclusivity stairs. High school GSA will paint the stairs as different types of pride flags.
 - A program to support STEM careers highlighting graduates that have gone on to STEM careers. (Tom)
 - A program for writing survival stories (Leo).
 - Funding to support a social justice magazine. (Leo)
 - Seed money to help with OWL students participating in Humboldt's band program.
