School Goals

Reading:

The percent of student scoring proficient or higher in reading will increase from 17.6% to 35% by Spring 2020 as measured by the MCA.

Math:

The percent of students scoring proficient or higher in math will increase from 16.7% to 35% by Spring 2020 as measured by the MCA.

In the Pre-K Classroom

The Pre-K team will work with students and their families to support students' academic success. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- In Pre-K we focus on speaking, listening, reading, and writing. We teach letter names, letter sounds, rhyming, and understanding how a book works.
- Colors, shapes, patterns, counting to 10 and working with numbers are primary math focuses in Pre-K.
- We will host a Take Your Parent to School Day (TYPTSD) in fall and spring so you can see your child in action and make home connections.
- During TYPTSDs and Parent Teacher Conferences, parents will receive take home activities for their child to grow in math and literacy.
- In Pre-K we build foundations for the IB (International Baccalaureate) Programme by including IB vocabulary and encouraging inquiry from the students.

At Home

Benjamin E. Mays IB World School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' academic success. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Come to the Take Your Parent to School Days (TYPTSD) in fall and spring.
- Have fun with the tools provided at TYPTSDs and conferences.
- Read together often.
- Talk with your child about colors, shapes and numbers in everyday life.
- Look for the classroom newsletter every week.
- Sign up for Remind in the fall (Remind is a parent communication App).
- Look for the Weekly Highlights e-mail and check backpack regularly.
