# **Meeting Overview**

## **Highlights**

- During committee time, Expo's Fourth Grade teachers shared an overview of the curriculum and highlights for the upcoming year.
  - There is a big jump between third and fourth grade due to the increase in academic rigor
  - Biggest opportunity is to fund and provide more hands on experiences in the classroom and around the cities, such as:

## 2. Regular Business

- Principal's update
  - I. Several job openings are posted
  - II. Enrollment continues to grow

      - Expo Gear also grossed \$346 and Silent Auction/Pub crawl \$2,265 that night.

      - c. Still anticipating check requests and will then report what we net from this fundraiser
  - II. Club's Choice
    - A. Club's Choice this year grossed \$11,791 including pending deposits (previous year, \$18,281).
    - B. Still anticipating invoices in the next couple of weeks and will then report what we net from that fundraiser.
  - III. Music Residency
    - A. First invoice for MacPhail was paid (\$10,440)
      - a. Motion needed to transfer money from Silent Auction to Music Residency to cover this year's expenses.
        - a. Motion carries all approve
  - IV. Annual filings
    - A. The IRS Form 990 and MN Attorney General's office annual report for last fiscal year (8/1/2018 7/31/2019) have been completed.
      - a. We need to approve these as a board.
    - B. The IRS Form 990 is a 21 page document, but several of pages do not contain much information. The pages that contain the bulk of the information are pages 1, 2, 7, and 14 with additional, supporting statements on pages 16-21 of the PDF. Similarly with the MN Attorney General's office report, the primary pages are pages 6 and 7.

  - I. Decided all proceeds will go to Treasure Island fundraising efforts
    - A. Communication / marketing efforts have begun to get the word out
- Treasure Island updates
  - I. Community Event
    - A. Well attend by the community despite the weather
    - B. The Villager was there and published an article on fundraising efforts
  - II. Fundraising Efforts
    - A. Match Donations
      - a. Secured a 10k match donation which has almost be matched (\$8k raised so far)
      - b. Additional 5k match donation has been secured
      - c. Match donations will be part of the GTTM communication
    - B. Continue to work on additional fundraising efforts
      - a. Picket Fundraiser individuals can sponsor a picket in the fence to leave a lasting memory
      - b. Reclaiming the Wood Sell or use parts of the playground word as material goods (i.e. picture frames)
  - III. Upcoming District Meeting
    - A. Discussion topics will include:
      - a. Adjusting the current footprint / design based on current funds
      - b. If different materials suppliers can be used to offset costs
