Washington Daily Schedule and Weekly Calendars

Washington is revising our Purple/Gold rotation starting Quarter 2. <u>Click here for the Washington Daily Schedule and Weekly Calendars</u>

The purpose of this of this change is:

- To eliminate student and family confusion about the schedule by having Purple and Gold on set days so that students are able to attend the synchronous Google Meets being held by their teachers.
- To allow teacher flexibility to determine what types of instruction will meet the needs of their students.
- To provide individual and small group targeted interventions.

Schedule changes:

- Mondays and Wednesdays will be Purple Days where students do coursework for Purple Day Classes.
- Tuesdays and Thursdays will be Gold Day Classes where students do coursework for Gold Day Classes.
- Fridays will be Eagle Days and will be designated as Purple or Gold Days. This day will be a day for students to get extra help from teachers and catch up on their work.

End of Quarter Grades

Campus is the system we use to track official grades, attendance etc. Schoology is the system we use to help teachers integrate online learning into their classrooms. Campus will continue to be used for attendance, progress marks (mid-quarter), and final grades (end of quarter).

How do I use Campus and Schoology to track my student's progress?

Teachers use Schoology to do these tasks:

- · Calculate the student's current grade.
- · Record summative grades for papers, tests, and projects
- Record formative grades for daily work, practice, homework, etc.
- Provide feedback or make comments on the student's work
- Provide resources (assignment sheets, rubrics, task guides, articles etc)
- Communicate what is happening in class.

Teachers use Campus to track attendance and report final grades. If you want to find out how your student is doing in class currently and what assignments they have coming up and missing, check Schoology. For attendance and final grades, check Campus. Login to Campus here.

Schoology allows families to set up a weekly/daily "Digest" which is an automatic email that is sent that includes all of the assignments and tests submitted since the last digest. It also includes the grades of those assignments/tests as well as any that are overdue. <u>Directions to set up Schoology Digest.</u>



Happy Fall, this quarter we have been working on the development of characters in our stories. We are also adding our thoughts about how the setting and mood can have an influence on their behavior. Please make sure your student has chosen an independent reading chapter book and is reading at home.

HUMAN BIOLOGY:

Human Biology is working on Human Body Systems. Students started by investigating a specific system before taking notes on all the systems. We will be using our knowledge of human bodies to compare to frogs and their body systems. There will be a quiz on Unit 2 November 17 & 18. Then in Unit 3 we are going to investigate virus spread as we know that COVID19 continues to be a serious issue in society. Students will use the "Solve the Outbreak" app to thinking about how disease spreads and how to pinpoint the clues to help us track down how viruses move. Next we will be digging into the essential tools of Biology and even building a using our own microscopes at which will arrive in the mail at each student's home. OT LITERACY:

We are continuing our exploration of the "dystopian" genre. Our examination of literary elements continues: plot, character, conflict, setting, and theme. For variety, we are mixing in non-fiction articles that are particularly interesting to teens.

HEALTH:

In Health and Human Biology class, we are in a unit on Mental/Emotional Health. Students are learning about how stress can affect mental and emotional health and healthy stress management techniques. Students are learning about common mental health disorders, including anxiety and depression, and the importance of seeking help for mental health concerns. In addition, students have learned about resources teens can access for help for Mental and Emotional Wellness. I encourage you to ask your student about these important topics they are learning in Health and Human Biology class!



LIFE SCIENCE:

Hello Washington families! In Life Science we're learning how to identify and classify living things, and as we transition into 2nd quarter we'll learn more about chemistry and how to think like a scientist! We hope your family is healthy and doing well!

ENGLISH LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT:

In ELD we are working on elements of stories. By knowing how the parts of a story work together, we are able to understand the story better. To gain a better understanding, we are looking at different stories and identifying the elements that make a story a story.





Thank you for partnering with our school community to support your student's success in Saint Paul Public Schools. We are excited to share several updates about our school counseling program for the 2020-2021 school year.

Starting this year your student will begin creating a Personal Learning Plan. Your student's Personal Learning Plan will track their interests, strengths, experiences and goals in order to help plan for their future in Saint Paul Public Schools and beyond. Your student will also have the chance to identify potential careers they might be interested in exploring as they progress through middle and high school.

We will be using a digital platform called Xello to track your student's Personal Learning Plan. Their Personal Learning Plan will be viewable by their classroom teachers, school counselors, social workers and school administrators. We are excited about this new tool because your student will have access to it as they progress through middle and high school.

Your school counselor will support your student through creating their Personal Learning Plan through the Core Counseling Curriculum. The Core Counseling Curriculum includes lessons that focus on social emotional learning, academic skill building and career planning. Students will also have the chance to work on their Personal Learning Plan through their Foundations class. In addition, all 8th grade students can look forward to an individualized meeting with their school counselor that focuses on their Personal Learning Plan. This individualized meeting will help your 8th grade student finish middle school strong and prepare for high school.

English

This month, students will write an argument essay. Students will read pro/con articles and decide which side they want to defend by using rhetorical devices to strengthen their argument. This unit will transition to our unit 4 which will focus on point of view and will center around the Declaration of Independence. Students will explore the guiding question "What happened to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness?" by reading several primary documents from several people and groups.

Algebra 1

The Algebra 2 classes have completed their study of Series and Sequences and are beginning to study Functions. We will be investigating properties of functions and how they apply to real world situations. Students will study exponential functions in the context of credit card debt, college loans and saving for retirement.

Biology

In SPC Biology, students are learning how cell membranes work to regulate and transport materials in and out efficiently. They will be learning about the structure of this essential feature and exploring why they are essential to all cells through labs and virtual activities. Ask your child what happened to the eggs!

In regular Biology students are finishing up their enzyme unit and moving onto cells! We will start by exploring the different types of cells and then looking into how the cells do the work to support life. We will be studying a dozen different organelles and the jobs they do to keep the cell alive and healthy. This will build on our previous coursework where we studied how the chemistry of the cell makes life possible.

Algebra 1

The Algebra 2 classes have completed their study of Series and Sequences and are beginning to study Functions. We will be investigating properties of functions and how they apply to real world situations. Students will study exponential functions in the context of credit card debt, college loans and saving for retirement.

Engineering

Students are learning about simple machines (currently the lever and the wheel). We are working on our algebra and problem solving skills that will be useful in college science classes, or just life in general.

Anatomy and Physiology

Hi I am Ms. Hobday and teach both the Anatomy honors and CIS Physiology courses. In the Honors course we are busy wrapping up our second unit on the Integumentary system. It is a great unit to put in some extra work on – as it is a 2 for 1. The students who earn a better grade on this exam and/or portfolio, will have their first exam and/or portfolio changed to that grade. Ask your student if they are working on their portfolio? Have they done an extra article? As for CIS Physiology – we too are completing a unit. The students have done a wonderful job with their lab reports and are preparing for a lab practical. This first quarter for both courses has been a learning adjustment for all; but I truly believe those that are sticking with me have worked beautifully at creating a learning environment that is working.



Email Digest Setup For Parents/Guardians


Schoology allows Parents/Guardians setup a weekly/daily "Digest" which is an automatic email that is sent that includes all of the assignments and tests submitted since the last digest. It also includes the grades of those assignments/tests as well as any that are overdue.

Within the app and/or browser go to "Account Settings"



Go to the "Notifications" tab and turn the "Email Summary" to On. Change the frequency and date/time you want the email to be sent.

What Is Schoology?

Schoology is an online Learning Management System that helps you stay informed about your student's classes, assignments and grades. You can use Schoology to:

- View your student's Courses and Groups
- View your student's upcoming, current and overdue assignments
- Monitor school and course announcements
- Stay involved in your student's education

How to Access Schoology

- Go to spps.org/onestop and click on Schoology.
- Use your One Stop username (g######) and password that you received in the mail to log in.
- If you don't have your One Stop username, contact your school's front office for assistance.

Using Your Parent/Guardian Schoology Account





Viewing your child's activity

Click on the dropdown menu arrow in the upper-right corner of your account next to your name. Select your child's name to view account activity.



Home

Both parents and students have separate Home Pages. Similar to Facebook, the Home Page is the first place a user lands after logging in to Schoology. Here, you'll see all events, activities or updates that have taken place.



Courses

Here you will find all your child's academic courses listed in a pull down menu. Click on a course to see more information, details or assignments.



Groups

Groups are most often used for information, activities, or special interests. For example, your child might belong to an athletic team that maintains a Schoology Group. Groups do not issue grades.

Note: Guardians are only able to see their own student's Schoology account, **Courses and Groups.** They are not able to join other Courses or Groups, or post comments, or see other student information.



Navigating Student Schoology Accounts:



Use the left menu to quickly view specific information about your student's Schoology Activity:

Summary: Click to see an overview of your student's courses and grades (Enrollments in the center column), or notifications about grades on individual assignments (Student Activity in the middle column).

Grades: Review your student's grades for all courses.

Mastery: If your student's school aligns materials to standards and learning objectives, you can check progress here.

Calendar: Click to view a calendar of past and upcoming events and assignments. Events and assignments in the near future are also listed in the Upcoming column on the right.

Messages: Parents do not have access to Messages.

- Select **Enrollments** in the center column to see a list of your student's current courses, along with their grade. The grade may not be displayed while the course is in progress, as in the grade column for U.S. History in the sample above. Click on an individual course to see grades for assignments, tests, and discussions.
- Here under **Groups**, you can see a list of your student's Schoology Groups. Groups can be used for a variety of activities, from school projects to extracurricular teams and clubs.
- The Recent Grades/Attendance section displays your student's recent grade. Attendance is not tracked in Schoology. Please refer to the One Stop Campus Portal link to check on attendance.
- The **Overdue** section displays a list of course materials your student did not turn in by the due date.
- 6 The **Upcoming** section displays a list of your student's upcoming assignments and events.
