Sixth Grade

English with Ms. Stedje:

Readers and Writers Workshop in 6th grade are working hard on analyzing and creating narrative stories.

Readers Workshop students are in the thick of analyzing characters and the psychological settings of their stories. We will also be delving into the world of theme and the many lessons our characters are learning about life.

Writers Workshop students are wrapping up the rough drafts of their personal narrative stories. We will be fine-tuning our final copies as we learn how to use paragraphs purposefully and learn about the key comma rules and correct structures of writing dialogue.

Ask your 6th grader to read you their personal narrative story. It might just be about you!

Seventh Grade

English with Ms. Steinhoff:

Currently, 7th graders are continuing to work on characterization in texts. We are investigating the perspective of characters in our shared novel "Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone" as well as in student's independent books. We are also working on some foundational writing pieces, specifically working on the five parts of a complete sentence and the different parts of speech. This will help us move towards our first big writing assignment this year where students will be writing their own memoirs! Keep an eye out for some fun and exciting news about 7th grade ELA in November!

Science with Mr. Altringer:

Murray students have planted and maintained the garden from spring through the summer, and now we are in the harvest season. Murray's e2 class has harvested over 100lbs of produce this fall for the Como Culinary Arts classes.







Social Studies with Ms. Atchison and Ms. Newman:

7th Grade American Studies -Seventh grade history recently wrapped up the Civil War and are now working on the Reconstruction Era. From there, we will begin work on the Progressive Era, including immigration, Industrial Revolution, Transcontinental Railroad, and the destruction of Native lifestyle.

Eighth Grade

Math with Mr. Hayden:

In Integrated Math, we just finished our unit on equations and inequalities. A lot of the unit reviewed some topics they learned in Algebra last year, but there were some new things to learn such as compound inequalities and absolute value equations and inequalities. Our next unit will be focused on linear functions, which will again be a mixture of review of some algebra topics and an introduction to some things that students have not seen before.

In Algebra, we are also wrapping up our first unit, which emphasizes solving equations. The main concept to master was the idea of using inverse operations to isolate a variable and solve for it. Our next unit will expand on that knowledge and apply it to solving inequalities, which is similar to solving equations but there are a few subtle differences.

In both classes we are still adjusting to our new Savvas curriculum, but we have started to work out some of the technology glitches and will be gradually progressing towards doing everything digitally.

Social Studies with Ms. Croone and Mr. Kareem:

Students in 8th grade Global Studies have just finished their first unit: The Tools of a Geographer. They made maps of an imaginary country to demonstrate their new geographic skills for the summative. Next, they will look at the 5 Themes of Geography- Movement, Region, Location, Human-Environment Interaction, and Place.


