MESSAGE FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

Please remember to keep your children home if they are not feeling well. Children should stay home if they have fever (temperature above 100.0), vomiting, diarrhea, or are exhibiting symptoms of COVID (see below).

More Common Symptoms: fever 100.4 or higher, cough, difficulty breathing, loss of taste or smell

Less Common Symptoms: sore throat, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, chills, muscle pain, extreme fatigue/tiredness, severe headache, nasal congestion/runny nose.

We have rapid COVID tests available if your child is exhibiting any COVID-like symptoms.

Also, colder weather is upon us. Students go outside as long as the temperature is not below -10F. Heavy jackets, hats, glove/mittens, boots, and snow pants will soon be needed for recess. Please send your children to school with appropriate gear for the weather.

DIGITAL LEARNING DAY

Students will be learning from home on Tuesday, Nov. 8th. There will be two synchronous* meetings, as well as asynchronous* work to complete throughout the day. Your child's classroom teacher will post in advance the Google meet links with times in Seesaw/Schoology.



*Synchronous: virtually attend a class session at the same time as your teacher and classmates.

*Asynchronous: allows you learn/complete work on your own schedule, within a certain timeframe.
