


The number of students attending school regularly



With strong community partnerships and the belief that our students come to us with many language and cultural assets, we strive to help them achieve at their highest levels. Culture Studies and Hmong Studies are embedded into our core academics to develop positive self-identities in our students and build strong cross-cultural relationships and understanding. Technology is integrated into learning in all subject areas to prepare students to be lifelong learners and problem solvers. Jackson Bementary established the first Hmong Dual Language Immersion Program in the country. Through the dual language program, PreK-5 students develop bilingual and biliteracy skills in both Hmong and English. Hmong Studies and Culture Studies are embedded into our core academics to develop positive self-identities and build strong cross-cultural relationships among students. Our program is open to all students — both native and non-native Hmong speakers.
