Teaching and Learning

- K-3 students who are reading below grade level: Parents are informed at conferences and other times throughout the year if their K-3 student is not on track for grade level reading.
 Students in grade 3 have an opportunity to attend the Extended Day for Learning after school program. Students in

K-3 who are below grade level in literacy will work with their teacher and family to build specific literacy skills. This could also include S-Term for grades K-3. Students will have technology security lessons at the beginning of the year. iPads are used in all grade levels to personalize learning. Schoology – This tool is used by upper grade teachers as a way to put learning online for students. Students post their work on Schoology as well. Seesaw – Grade PreK-2 classrooms use Seesaw as the platform for their online learning. Teachers post instruction/curriculum on Seesaw and students post work. Schoology and/or Seesaw – provide information about the use of these learning management systems at your school Many before- and after-school enrichment and support opportunities are available for students A variety of after school classes are taught through the Groveland Recreation Center. Flyers are available to families through the rec center and the Groveland office. Class information is also sent home through the school newsletter, Panda Paws.
